## Scotsman claims annual Grandfather marathon race

Since it's such a big part of the Highland Games, perhaps it's no more than fitting that a Scotsman win the Grandfather Mountain Marathon.

On Saturday, David Caborn did just that, crossing the finish line first with a time of 2:54.55.

Caborn, 32, is a native of Edinburgh, Scotland, and has only been in the United States since 1981. He is currently a resident in orthopedic surgery in Greenville, S.C., and this was his first win ever in a marathon.

"Yes, this is the first time I've ever won one," he said. "This is my third year running this course, and the experience really helped me this year I think."

There were some 137 participants in the grueling 26.2-mile race, and the course is generally considered one of the tougher ones in the country. But Caborn says that even though the course is demanding, he enjoys running it.

"I personally find this course very enjoyable," he said. "The hills are tough, but it's so scenic. It's a beautiful area."

Caborn said a big reason for his success this year is making the adjustment to those hills in his preparation for the event, but admits that finding enough time to train properly was a problem.

"I've been running every other day, with one long run a week involving a lot of hills," he said. "But my profession keeps me very busy."

In addition to the intense physical aspect of running a marathon, there is also a definite mental part to competing. Caborn said he had a specific strategy in mind while running this year's race.

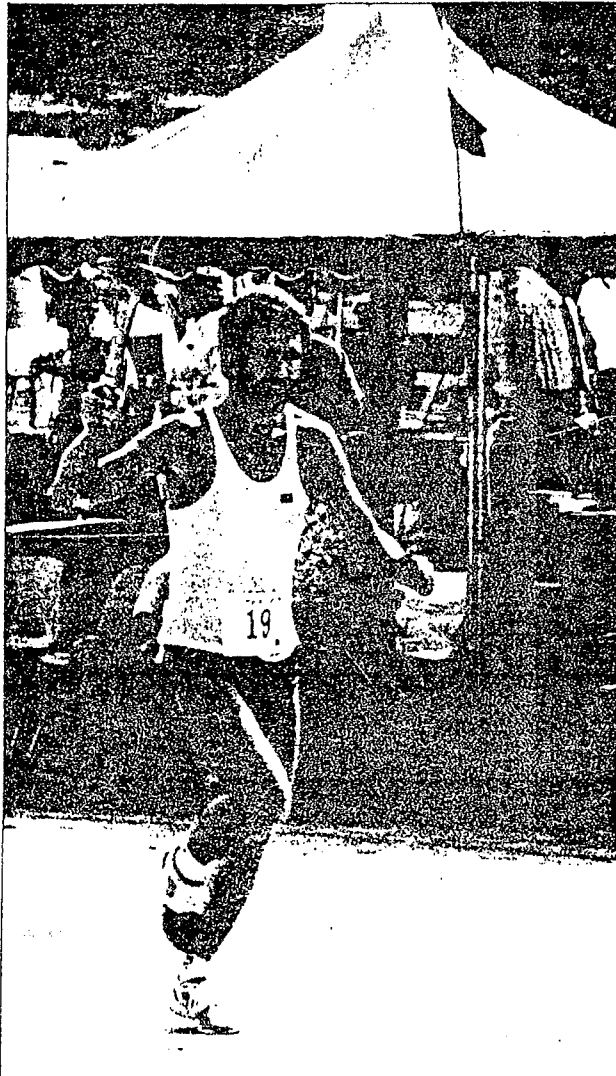
"I stayed back the first 18 miles of the race," he said. "And then I made my push during the last eight."

Obviously, Caborn's preparation for the race, both physical and mental, paid off.

"It wasn't the best time I've ever run," he said. "But I'd have to say that it's my best run overall."

Caborn said he plans to compete in as many marathons as time allows but that there is one in particular that tops his list.

"I'll be back here next year," he said. "This is a great course."
